


This year is also the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Royal British Legion, whose Burbage branch co-ordinated the parish Remembrance parade.

Poppy Pilgrimage

The Chairman of the Parish Council, Cllr Keith Lynch, welcomed pupils from Hastings High School to the village war memorial, where they laid a wreath as part of the University of Leicester's Poppy Pilgrimage, marking the 100th anniversary of the University's foundation.

Since 2018, students and staff, together with both serving and retired members of the Armed Forces, have laid more than 50 wreaths across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland in recognition of local people who made sacrifices during the First World War.


