Awards night at Annual Meeting



The Annual Parish Meeting is a chance for residents to find out about the work of the Parish Council during the past year.

To be held at Millennium Hall on Monday 7th March at 6.30pm, the meeting will see the Chairman of the Council, Cllr Keith Lynch present a report outlining issues addressed and projects carried out by the council in the past 12 months.

There will then be an opportunity for members of the public to ask questions and make comments.

The meeting will also include the presentation of two awards:

The **Chairman's Award** is given to an individual whose efforts have made a positive difference within



the parish. The recipient will also be presented with the John Moore Community Vase, named in honour of a former Parish Council chairman, to hold for a year.

The **Pat Armstrong Allotment Award**, launched in 2018 in memory of the Council's former Project Officer, is given to the tenant of the Council allotment judged by members of the Allotments Working Party to be the most productive and attractive throughout the year.

A schools' competition to design a winner's plaque to be displayed on the chosen plot was won by Ella Jordan, of Burbage Junior School (design pictured left). Fellow Junior School pupil Billy Smith's design was chosen as runner-up (right).
