Arriva bus service changes

Campaigning Burbage Councillors have helped to secure improvements to Arriva bus services in the parish. Councillors Dawn Glenville, Richard Flemming and Stuart Bray lobbied the bus company to return services to Far Lash. As a result, Arriva has made changes to Service 8 and to Services 6, 6A, 6B & 7 (now to be numbered either 7 or 7A), which can be read in full by following links on the Council's website. Head of Commercial for Arriva Midlands, Toby France, said the members had **"been instrumental in delivering these improvements for residents"**.

Council takes on new open spaces

After years of negotiations with the developer of the historic Sketchley Dye Works site surrounding Rugby Road, the sports ground and park, along with a small community space and early years playground at Amber Way, have now been successfully transferred to Burbage Parish Council.

Following the initial landscaping plan carried out by the developer on the park, issues were identified with areas not being laid out in accordance with the plans, including unsatisfactory drainage and lack of grounds management, allowing the uncontrolled spread of weeds. This resulted in the park becoming an unattractive, uninviting space for much needed leisure and recreation - a far cry from its heyday as the Sketchley Works sports field. An agreed sum has been provided by the developer to enable the Parish Council to start immediately on bringing the grassed areas back up to a good standard, by weeding and re-seeding, followed by rolling to even out the surface.

The Parish Council also plans to upgrade and refurbish the existing play equipment at Rugby Road to improve the play experience for youngsters.

New signage to be installed at Rugby Road park and Amber Way community space and playground will welcome visitors to what is hoped will become a much valued and well-used park once again.

The Parish Council is very grateful to the Borough Council's planning team who ensured that these provisions were secured as part of the original planning consent, and to Borough officer Lesley Keal in particular for her perseverance in ensuring the developer's planning conditions were fulfilled and the transfers successfully completed.

Parish Council Chairman, Cllr David Bill said: "The completion of the transfer of the Rugby Road site to the Parish Council is testament to the co-operation and persistence over many years by the Borough Council and the Parish Council. The hard work and patience by all concerned has at last paid off. The Amber Way transfer is another most welcome move."
