# **Awards at Annual Parish Meeting**

Two awards are to be presented to parishioners at Burbage's **Annual Parish Meeting on Monday March 4 at Millennium Hall.** 

The **Chairman's Award** is given to a group or individual whose efforts have made a positive impact within the parish in the past 12 months, and the **Pat Armstrong Allotment Award** is presented to the tenant of the Council plot judged to have been the most productive and attractive over the past year.

Last year's winners were volunteer parish litter picker Paul Taylor and allotmenteer Bob Gwynn.

The meeting, which starts at **6.30pm** is open to all and gives residents an opportunity to find out more about the work of the Council. Council Chairman, Cllr David Bill will present a report of issues addressed and projects carried out by the Council in the past 12 months and attendees will be able to ask questions.

A competition to design a winner's plaque for the Allotment Award, named in memory of a former Council Project Officer, was entered by pupils from Burbage CofE Infant School and residents of Moat House.

Designs, pictured, by pupils Seren Jones and Pippa Mayne, and residents June Gibbs and Jean Scott will feature on plaques to be put on the winning plot and for the winning tenant to keep.

The winner of the Chairman's Award will be presented with the John Moore Community Vase, named in honour of a former Council Chairman, to hold for a year.
