News

Summary of incidents in Burbage this month

In **October**, there have been **151** calls to Police regarding incidents in Burbage. **33** of these were emergency calls (requiring a 15-minute response) and **57** were priority calls.

- Stop and searches completed at locations including Rugby Road Park, Forrester Road and Burbage Road.
- Theft of a LandRover Range Rover from **Salisbury Road**. Recovered.
- Attempt burglary on Lucas Road, disturbed by resident, nothing taken.
- Dog attacks on other dogs (Windsor Street/Lychgate Lane). Two dogs seized by Police, investigation ongoing.
- Catalytic converter stolen from a Honda Jazz and a Toyota at Hinckley Island Hotel.
- VRM plates stolen from vehicles on Winchester Drive, Brookfield Road and Flamville Road.
- Reports of suspicious activity reported on Brookside and Cowper Road, may be linked to vehicle crime.
- Report of an Attempt vehicle theft of a Ford Focus on Belfry Close.
- Criminal damage to fence panels along Grove Road. Linked to anti-social behaviour, suspects identified and investigation ongoing.

#YouSaidWeDid

You said – **Vehicle crime** (theft of and theft from)

We did — There have been few incidents this month of actual vehicle theft in Burbage but activity around vehicle crime appears to be increasing as it typically does around this time of year. We have completed door to doors and CCTV work where there has been reports of suspicious behaviour. We have also completed our "Darker Nights" crime prevention event at Burbage Millennium Hall. We continue to support residents with sold at cost RFID wallets and offer support where needed around crime prevention. Many of the recent reports including suspicious behaviour appear to be opportunistic attempts so it is vital you check that you leave nothing in your vehicle and ensure doors are locked. Car key wallets and steering locks really do make a difference. Officers have also been completing stop checks in Burbage overnight on vehicles.

You said - Anti-Social Behaviour

We did – Reports of ASB range from youth related to neighbour disputes. We have been dealing with youths this month which involves home visits, partnership working, safeguarding work and supporting victims with resolutions. We have had some really good results and hopefully those involved will learn from this behaviour and that it will not be accepted. Incidents includes (for adults and children) fighting, criminal damage, drugs, arguments and general nuisance behaviour.

You said - Road Safety

We did – Work has been done around parking complaints, we are not able to deal with all complaints as resource is limited. Some complaints may also be better dealt with by LCC as Police have different powers (yellow lines parking tickets etc get dealt with by LCC). A lot of complaints we get relate to other residents parking, sometimes it can be resolved by speaking to your neighbour with your concern if you are happy to do so. We do what we can to deal with road safety concerns as can be evidence by work done with local schools. We have also removed vehicles, completed stop checks and will be launching our drink/drug drive campaign this month following recent months where several drivers in Burbage were arrested for drink drive. We will also be out with the speed gun over the coming weeks at locations requested by Burbage residents.
